On 8/1/68 IC [REDACTED] caused the records of the LAPD to be checked but no record identifiable was located.

On 8/2/68 DAVID ESQUITH was recontacted by the writer at which time he advised that he had no additional information concerning AL ROTHSTEIN, that they met only on the night of the assassination and to his knowledge ROTHSTEIN has been a volunteer for KENNEDY for only a few days. ESQUITH further stated that ROTHSTEIN was not in the immediate area of the shooting and could probably furnish no information which had not already been obtained.

In view of the fact that investigation set out above has been unsuccessful in locating ROTHSTEIN, it is suggested that efforts to interview him be discontinued.

[redacted] Fairfield, Connecticut, since 1959, and he always has found him to be a person of high morals, character and reputation.

He said he attended the dinner at the Americana Hotel, Miami Beach, Florida, during the conference of the National Automobile Dealers Association, truck meeting, and that [redacted] was present, and he heard [redacted] was making remarks concerning segregation; however, since the remarks were not made to him, he could not recall any definite statements he may have made.

He said he gathered from the remarks that [redacted] had some feelings regarding segregation as there apparently had been some trouble in Fairfield, Connecticut. He stated he did not feel [redacted] meant anything by his remarks and he put no significance in them as he had been drinking.

He recalled that [redacted] Lima, Ohio, was present, as well as [redacted] Nashville, Tennessee, and [redacted] Bristol, Tennessee.

He said after the meeting, [redacted] and [redacted] made a trip to Jamaica, and they discussed the remarks of [redacted] but they put no significance to them. He said that if [redacted] is contacted, he is sure he could explain his remarks.

b7D [REDACTED] advised that about May 18, 1968, he attended a conference of the National Automobile Dealers Association truck meeting at the Americana Hotel, Miami Beach, Florida, and one evening during dinner he was with a group of people which included [REDACTED] Fairfield, Connecticut, when [REDACTED] made some statements to the effect he had attended some meetings and knew what was going to happen to MARTIN LUTHER KING and "BOBBY" KENNEDY.

[REDACTED] reportedly said that KENNEDY would be killed, and he would never get into office. [REDACTED] did not mention what meetings he had attended or where the meetings were held.

[REDACTED] said [REDACTED] had been drinking, and he [REDACTED] had never met him before, and, therefore, there was some discussion concerning [REDACTED] comments among the people present.

[REDACTED] further advised that [REDACTED] Bristol, Virginia, as well as a man from Nashville, Tennessee, and one from Ohio, may have heard the comments of [REDACTED]. He stated [REDACTED] was a good friend of [REDACTED] and would be able to evaluate [REDACTED] and his remarks.

[redacted] Nashville, Tennessee advised as follows:

During May of 1968 he attended a conference of the National Automobile Dealers Association in Miami Beach, Florida, which was attended by a number of truck dealers throughout the United States. On one evening during this series of meetings he was with a group of individuals including [redacted] Fairfield, Connecticut [redacted] of [redacted] Ohio. Everyone in this group of some twenty to twenty-five men had been drinking heavily and conversations could only be described as extremely "alcoholic."

On one occasion, [redacted] made some remark to the effect that ROBERT KENNEDY would never live to become President, if he were nominated and elected, that someone would probably shoot him. [redacted] did not say that he had attended any meeting where this was discussed, nor was any conversation recalled with reference to MARTIN LUTHER KING.

He does not recall any other remarks of [redacted] and does not recall discussing [redacted] remarks on a subsequent trip to Jamaica, which he made accompanied by other men at the conference.

He paid absolutely no attention to [redacted] remark regarding KENNEDY, since he was drinking heavily, as were most of the men at the conference.

He describes [redacted] as an "ultra conservative", a loyal American, and one who would have no part in the death of KENNEDY or KING.

On 8/7/68, SA [REDACTED] in connection with his liaison responsibilities pertaining to captioned investigation, was advised by Lieutenant CHARLES HIGBIE, LAPD, S. U. S., as follows:

An individual by the name of JIM FLUG, reportedly a former member of the ROBERT F. KENNEDY official family, was in charge of threatening mail by KENNEDY. Following the assassination of KENNEDY, FLUG, whose offices were then in Washington, D. C., was contacted by Agents of the United States Secret Service and the FBI. On that occasion, a Secret Service Agent by the name of [REDACTED] and an unidentified Agent of the FBI were given all information then in FLUG's possession concerning threatening mail received by KENNEDY.

Lieutenant HIGBIE requested, if possible, all information made available to the United States Secret Service and FBI pertaining to threatening mail received by KENNEDY be made available to his department.

On August 23, 1968, Joseph Willard "Pappy" Luke, owner of Pappy's Stew House, General Delivery, Highway 90, Raywood, Texas, advised he had been unable to recall anything additional concerning the description or comments of the man who came into his restaurant on May 23, 1968 and made various claims regarding his intention to kill a senator in California. Luke advised the photograph of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan which he viewed around the first of August, 1968 was in his opinion identical to that man who came into his restaurant on May 23, 1968. Luke advised he has never owned a television set nor has he viewed anyone else's television set within the last six months. Luke stated he could not read and has not looked at a newspaper for several years. He advised he was certain he had not seen a photograph of Sirhan until a photograph was shown him by the FBI. Luke stated he was hard of hearing but he was certain the man had said what Luke reported on June 5, 1968.

A photograph of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan was shown the following residents of Raywood, Texas on August 23, 1968. None of the persons had ever observed anyone similar to Sirhan in Raywood.

Enclosed for the Bureau are six copies of a LHM reflecting investigation conducted in Raywood, Texas on 8/23/68. Enclosed for Los Angeles are two copies of LHM.

On 6/24/68, [REDACTED] Office, Raywood, Texas advised J.V. "PAPPY" LUKE is not, in his opinion, senile in any way and does not let his imagination run away from him. LUKE is hard of hearing, does misunderstand people, and could hear part of a story and fill in the remainder in such a way as to change the story. [REDACTED] advised LUKE speaks loudly and likes to gripe about all sorts of things. LUKE may have appeared sympathetic to someone who opened up and disclosed to LUKE that person's true beliefs. [REDACTED] restated the fact that LUKE is hard of hearing and may have simply misconstrued what someone said. [REDACTED] did not observe the man described by LUKE or any vehicle similar to that driven by the man. [REDACTED] had no idea who the man may have been that LUKE described. [REDACTED] viewed a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and advised he had never seen anyone similar to this person in Raywood.



Lieutenant PENA stated that his department also received information that FRED DUTTON and/or FRANK MARSHALL were likewise present in the ambulance.

In addition to the above information furnished by Lieutenant PENA, the Los Angeles Office received information that WARREN ROGERS of "Look" Magazine may also have been in the ambulance.

One of the ambulance attendants interviewed advised that two individuals were riding in the front of the ambulance with the driver, one of whom was WILLIAM BARRY.

On September 3, 1968, at approximately 3-25pm, the writer was summoned to the reception room for the purpose of talking with Mr.'s, MICHAEL McCOWAN, and RONALD ALLEN, who identified themselves as, "defense investigators for Defense Attorney, RUSSELL E. PARSONS, who is acting in behalf of accused assassin SIRHAN SIRHAN." (See business card).

UPON taking the men into an interview room, they stated they had come to the Los Angeles Office hoping to see and interview the "Agent" assigned to the SIRHAN case. They were advised the "Agent" handling the case was not available, but if they cared to make any request or leave any information, this writer would be sure it was directed to the proper administrative authority.

McCOWAN, acting as spokesman for the two, stated he would like to specifically request the following:

McCOWAN stated they understood the FBI has conducted some 600 plus interviews of persons in attendance at the Ambassador Hotel on the night of the KENNEDY assassination attempt. He said they would like to specifically request a copy of that list of people in attendance who were interviewed.

Secondly, they specifically wanted to know, if, during the course of these interviews, it had been brought out or mentioned by anyone interviewed that they specifically heard of, or observed the accused assassin, SIRHAN SIRHAN, either consuming or being served any alcoholic beverages in the hall that night.

McCOWAN again reiterated this was a specific request and they therefore expected some type of answer.

They were advised their request would be made a matter of official record, at which time they left.

U. S. Attorney WILLIAM M. BYRNE was telephonically contacted following the appearance of MICHAEL MC COWAN and RONALD ALLEN and their request for a list of persons interviewed by the FBI in this investigation.

Mr. BYRNE advised that any such request would properly be directed to the prosecuting authorities, which in this instance is not the Federal Government. The prosecution is in the hands of the District Attorney's Office for the County of Los Angeles.

At 5:05 P.M., 9/3/68, the writer telephonically contacted RONALD ALLEN, of R. ALLEN & Associates, and advised Mr. ALLEN that his request for such a list of persons interviewed would properly be directed by Mr. PARSONS to the prosecuting authorities, and that the Federal Government is not prosecuting SIRHAN B. SIRHAN, and, accordingly, his request should be directed to the District Attorney's Office. He was also advised that the FBI operates under the rules and regulations of the Department of Justice, and that if either he or Mr. PARSONS had any request to make concerning any investigation, it should be directed to the U. S. Attorney's Office, and not directed to the FBI.

Mr. ALLEN advised that the reason he had contacted the FBI was that the investigative staff of the Los Angeles Police Department had informed Mr. MC COWAN that if they wanted to know who was interviewed by the FBI, the FBI would be the people to contact.

Mr. ALLEN was again advised that his request should be directed to the prosecuting authorities and not the FBI.



NOGUCHI, M.D. On 9/3/68, MC ROY again discussed this matter with NOGUCHI, at which time he was unable to obtain from NOGUCHI an opinion as to whether or not a copy of the autopsy report would be made available to any agency prior to the commencement of the SIRHAN trial. MC ROY further explained that NOGUCHI is well aware that the previously imposed court instructions with respect to release of information in this investigation does not apply to the FBI.

MC ROY stated he would again contact NOGUCHI and attempt to obtain from him a decision with respect to furnishing a copy of the autopsy report, as well as photographs taken at the time of the autopsy.

On 9/3/68, Deputy Los Angeles County District Attorney DAVID FITTS advised his office has not yet received a copy of the autopsy report on KENNEDY and does not expect that it will be released by Dr. NOGUCHI until the trial commences.

Los Angeles will continue to follow this matter and keep the Bureau appropriately advised.

For the information of the Bureau, Governor RONALD REAGAN of California on 9/3/68 vetoed a bill passed by the 1968 Legislature which had been co-authored by Assembly Speaker JESSE M. UNRUH (Democrat, Inglewood), which bill would have required persons wanting to make use of the official autopsy pictures of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY to obtain a court order. The "Los Angeles Times" of 9/4/68 advised that the restriction had originally been requested by District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER of Los Angeles County, who feared there would be a wide demand for KENNEDY photographs by exploiters and the morbidly curious. The article reflected a statement by the Governor that he vetoed the bill because it is "so badly worded that it would have the unintended effect of impeding the legitimate use of autopsy photographs in medical education and research." The Governor also advised that medical researchers and forensic pathologists had complained that the bill would have had a detrimental effect on scientific advancement.

**DANIEL JOHN CURTIN**, [REDACTED]  
New Jersey, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

CURTIN advised that in June, 1968, he was a full-time student, majoring in [REDACTED] Los Angeles, California, during the time preceding the California Primary. He was a supporter and worker in the campaign of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. On election day, June 4, 1968, he was engaged during the greater part of the day in transporting voters to the polls. At approximately 8:00 P. M. he went to the Ambassador Hotel to take part in a KENNEDY victory party for the press and campaign workers.

CURTIN stated that at twelve midnight he was in the ballroom of the Ambassador Hotel, when Senator KENNEDY delivered his victory speech. CURTIN said that his location during the speech was to the right front of the podium approximately three feet from Senator KENNEDY. This location is as he was facing the podium. CURTIN said that Senator KENNEDY's speech lasted approximately nine to ten minutes, and at the conclusion of the speech he (CURTIN) engaged in jubilant shouting with the rest of the individuals in the ballroom.

CURTIN advised that at the end of the speech Senator KENNEDY turned and proceeded through the curtains at the rear of the podium into an anteroom. CURTIN stated that he then climbed over the podium and followed the crowd as it was surging after Senator KENNEDY. He stated that he was caught up in the movement of the crowd and proceeded through the anteroom into a corridor and then turned right and proceeded toward the kitchen area. CURTIN stated that he did not actually see Senator KENNEDY throughout the entire time that the group was moving through the anteroom into the corridor but caught intermittent glances of Senator KENNEDY through the moving crowd. CURTIN stated that the procession moved through swinging doors into a pantry area, and at the time he was approximately 15 feet behind Senator KENNEDY. CURTIN said that as he was about to go through the swinging doors he heard one loud report followed by two other loud reports in quick succession. CURTIN

said that he then jumped quickly through the swinging doors and observed Senator KENNEDY falling to the floor in the pantry corridor.

CURTIN stated that the crowd of people immediately behind Senator KENNEDY seemed to suddenly open, enabling him to lunge to the side of Senator KENNEDY as he fell to the floor. CURTIN stated that Senator KENNEDY fell to his right and threw his right arm up in the air as if to grasp the right side of his head.

CURTIN advised that he was one of the very first, if not the first person, to reach Senator KENNEDY, and he immediately handed Senator KENNEDY a string of rosary beads. CURTIN and KENNEDY clutched the beads as CURTIN placed his lips near KENNEDY's ear and began an Act of Contrition prayer.

CURTIN stated that mass confusion in the area occurred at this time, and he recalled hearing various individuals around him screaming, and asking him if he was a priest. CURTIN stated that at this point after being over Senator KENNEDY for approximately a minute an unknown man helped him to his feet and told him that he had done all that could be done. This individual helped CURTIN a few feet away and at this point Mrs. ETHEL KENNEDY and her sister had arrived at KENNEDY's side.

CURTIN stated that it was at this time that he observed ROSIE GREER and several other individuals holding a person later determined to be SIRHAN SIRHAN in the area of the bins several feet down the corridor from KENNEDY's location. CURTIN stated that the surging crowd was screaming and trying to get to SIRHAN, but GREER and others were protecting SIRHAN from the crowd, and at the same time they were trying to subdue him.

CURTIN said that he did not observe the shots being fired, and as he was leaning over Senator KENNEDY, KENNEDY appeared as if he was starting to say something, but if anything was actually said, the noise of the crowd prevented CURTIN from understanding it.

CURTIN stated that during the next few minutes he was in a state of near shock but recalls the press and television commentators around him asking questions and following him wherever he went in the corridor.

At this time an individual who identified himself as STU BLOCK came to CURTIN's assistance and took him upstairs in the hotel away from the press and television commentators. CURTIN stated that BLOCK told him that he was from San Diego and was a member of the KENNEDY staff. While upstairs in the hotel, CURTIN was also assisted by STEPHEN SMITH, a KENNEDY staff member.



## APPENDIX

### W. E. B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA (DCA)

A source advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates were told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention.

The second source advised in September, 1966, that Mike Zagarell, CPUSA Youth Director, stated that in Negro communities the Party still supported the plan to build "left" socialist centers and to solidify the Party base through the DCA. This source also advised in September, 1966, that Daniel Rubin, CPUSA National Organizational Secretary, stated the Party believes the DCA should have a working-class outlook and be a mass organization favorable to socialism, socialist countries and Marxism, and in April, 1967, advised that Gus Hall, CPUSA General Secretary, indicated the DCA primary emphasis should be on developing mass resistance to the draft.

A third source advised in September, 1967, that Jarvis Tyner was elected chairman of the DCA on September 10, 1967, at the Third National Convention of the DCA held in New York, New York, from September 8-10, 1967.

A fourth source advised during August, 1967, that Jarvis Tyner is a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.

A fifth source advised on September 21, 1967, that the headquarters of the DCA is located at 34 West 17th Street, New York, New York.

Mr. JAMES E. SMITH telephonically advised that he had just returned from Australia and had learned through a friend that the FBI in Los Angeles had indicated an interest in talking to him. SMITH stated that he holds dual citizenship in the United States and Australia and at the time of this assassination was working for the campaign of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. He advised that he did not witness the actual shooting, and at the approximate time of the assassination he was just about to enter the Ambassador Hotel.

According to SMITH, he determined that the FBI was interested in talking with him from a female acquaintance of his, Miss JOAN HULL of Los Angeles, California, who has already been questioned by the FBI. SMITH said that he did not know SIRHAN SIRHAN and did not believe he could furnish any information concerning the assassination; however, he indicated he wanted to cooperate with the FBI in any way he could.

This request has been discussed with Deputy Chief HOUGHTON, who advised that the LAPD, in connection with its investigation of the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, desires that every possible investigative lead be explored. Deputy Chief HOUGHTON advised that the LAPD has no positive information that any of the guests possess any knowledge of the assassination, but that they feel that some possible criticism could arise in later years if this step were not taken at this time. The LAPD is currently locating and interviewing 119 persons who were guests at the hotel and who are readily locatable in the Los Angeles area.

The LAPD has been informed that in view of the substantial number of interviews involved and the nature of the request, it would be referred to our Washington headquarters for consideration.

I talked to [REDACTED] shortly after I had spoken to you early in the afternoon this past June 12th. During the conversation I mentioned I had been at the Ambassador Hotel from about 3:20 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. on June 4, 1968. Up to that time [REDACTED] did not know I had been at the Hotel on the fourth and so I spoke about some of the things I had seen there that day. The individual who I described as the "ambling-gaited" man, because of the way in which he walked, was of particular interest to [REDACTED] who, in view of the topic of our conversation, then told me for the first time that he had submitted a Report to the Los Angeles Police Department which he believed could have some relevance to the tragedy that took place at the Hotel on June 5th. and that he had referred to a swarthy man whose manner of walking could be said to be a "waddle", for the man "waddled" when he walked. After a little more discussion concerning this individual, it seemed quite possible the "ambling-gaited" man and the man who "waddled" could be the same person. As a result of this conversation, I decided to write down as much as I could recall about what I had seen at the Hotel on the fourth and to submit the information to the same Officer who [REDACTED] had seen at the Los Angeles Police Department at 150 North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, Officer [REDACTED] of the Detective Bureau, Homicide Division, whose Office is located in Room #803; his telephone number is 624-3211, extension [REDACTED].

I saw [REDACTED] during the afternoon of July 3rd. at the Los Angeles Police Department and gave him the Report. I was not as particular as usual about the grammar I used because I wanted to get the information to him as quickly as possible so that he could evaluate my observations along with [REDACTED] Report. I also showed [REDACTED] a copy of a letter, over the name of an [REDACTED] appearing in the "Voice of the People" column of the June 12, 1968 edition of the Citizen News; [REDACTED] made several copies of the letter. [REDACTED] who had originally called my attention to [REDACTED] letter, told me its writer in all likelihood is [REDACTED] the man who "waddles" when he walks and who might possibly be the "ambling-gaited" man I had seen. The photograph shown to me at the L.A.P.D., although two years old, bears a close resemblance to the man I had seen.

I corrected some grammatical errors on pages 20, 27 and 28 of the Report since July 3rd. and mailed the corrections to [REDACTED] on August 19, 1968.

You will find enclosed with this letter copies of [REDACTED] letter and the Report, pages numbered 680702001 through 680702028, 6806041300-1315 and 680604-1655-1700 which I submitted to [REDACTED]. You may keep all of the material. Incidentally, the thirty single sheets of the enclosed Report were reproduced from

the original copies free of charge at [REDACTED] through the authorization [REDACTED] the Report was run in my presence by one of his secretaries from the [REDACTED] I appreciate [REDACTED] cooperation and thoughtfulness here very much because at the rate of fifteen cents per sheet, it saved me some money.

I did not tell [REDACTED] I had spoken to you on June 12th.; although in explaining the date-number system I used to set up the pages, I told him I had used this method in numbering the pages of other different Reports I had written in the past.

Since the day I spoke to you and referred to the rude young woman with the deformed nose, I have tried to determine a more accurate approximation of her probable height and have arrived at figures of from five feet to five feet three inches tall instead of the five feet five inches I had mentioned in our telephone conversation. I made this calculation by recalling as closely as possible the angle at which I looked down at the young woman when she very nearly walked into me and then measured the result from a point I noted on the wall. It isn't very scientific and certainly does not guarantee absolute accuracy, but it is better than a guess and is as close as I can come to her probable height considering the sketchy information available.

I mentioned the automobile accidents in the Report, both of which are on record at the L.A.P.D., to give [REDACTED] an idea how my memory works and also to clarify what I had said to him earlier. My memory is very good, and in fact, I believe it is well above average but not perfect. Therefore I wanted to bring out the fact that now and then a detail tends to be neutralized in my memory process for some reason as indicated by the first of the two accident reports I cited and is verifiable by checking with the Officer to whom I spoke in regard to that accident. I brought up this subject in reference to the young woman I had seen in the covered walkway at the Ambassador Hotel and had noted in the Report. For in consideration of these factors and what I positively do recall, I believe there is almost a 100% certainty that she was the "polka dot lady" who was sought by the Authorities just after the fatal shooting at the Hotel. I also referred to the [REDACTED] auto accident to let [REDACTED] know that that was the rear-end accident I mentioned when I called him on 7-1-68. Otherwise if I had only cited the earlier accident, occurring on [REDACTED], which does offer some proof concerning the point I wished to make in regard to my memory and [REDACTED] had decided to check it out, he would have discovered that it was not of the rear-end type at all; and since I am selling accuracy to the best of my ability here, I thought it best, although afield from the subject matter of the Report, to give him the source of my comment.

vehicle down Kenmore Avenue.  
I do not recall observing the  
old sedan earlier when I had  
tried to clear the broken glass  
from the parking space near  
Wilshire Blvd. After the car  
had started to roll more easily,  
one young man stopped pushing  
the sedan - ran through the traffic  
toward the sidewalk - waved to the  
darker man who continued to push

The automobile, and it joinedly went down the sidewalk westward on Wilshire Blvd. and out of my line of sight. Each man had waved to one another; it appeared as though they knew each other.

The person who walked west probably was wearing a t-shirt, had dark curly hair and may have been Italian, Jewish or Mexican. The other strong young man who continued to push the car off of Wilshire Blvd had a darker complexion and appeared to be a Mexican American type. He was probably 5'8" to 5'11" in height, seemed rather strong but not muscular. He had very dark hair which appeared straight and probably was black. He

was well built and was in his early twenties or perhaps younger. He was not handsome and was dressed much as the man who had initially helped to push the old sedan across Wilshire Blvd.

4. As the darker young man pushed the vehicle down Kenmore, it gained momentum and started to coast rapidly. During this period a series of interesting things took place. The sedan suddenly rocked sharply from side to side more than once; the car door on the driver's side swung open and the vehicle momentarily veered in the direction of where parked causing me to observe the near frantic going-on with far greater

interest than at first.

5. After things settled down somewhat, the darker young man who had been pushing the old sedan began racing along side the vehicle. And after several attempts was able to jump into the driver's seat. These actions took place opposite my car, and the man who jumped into the rapidly coasting automobile did not close the car door until after the vehicle had passed my vantage point.

6. Therefore I was able to look into the old sedan as it went by just prior to the moment that the young man racing overtaken jumped into the driver's seat; and I saw a small dark complexioned

young man with dark curly hair moving over toward the passenger side of the front seat from the vicinity of the steering wheel in order to make room for the man racing beside the car.

7. The dark young man (whether Negro or Black), now safely in the driver's seat and steering the automobile down the street, looked over at me where I was seated in my parked car, and he appeared startled or else that may be his usual countenance. At that particular moment, he appeared to me to have large "circular eyes". They were wide open and a good description would be "owl-like". He then looked ahead to see

where he was steering the car and then looked back over his shoulder in my direction once again as the car coasted north down Kenmore Avenue beyond my parking space. During this time he apparently tried to use the forward momentum of the car to start the automobile engine. The engine "coughed" a great deal and did not sound as though it would start at all. I believe the automobile may have stalled at the bottom of Kenmore Ave. at Sixth Street. I then left my automobile and headed toward the Ambassador

Hotel and looked down the street  
once again toward the place  
where the car apparently had  
stopped. It seemed as though  
the two young men recognized  
some people there who may  
have helped them.

I definitely could recognize and  
identify the old sedan noted in  
these comments at this time  
and probably would recall the license  
plate letter-number series upon  
seeing the plate again. It came for  
some reason, it stands out in  
my mind as being unusual and  
somewhat different from the usual  
run of license plates (California)  
although I can not state what  
it is at the moment.

As she approached me in the walking I glanced at her eyes in order to

I also noticed that her nose  
seemed deformed. It appeared very  
narrow, cylindrical on her right

had a small bump in the middle  
usually attributed to Semitic  
people. She definitely was not  
Caucasian nor was she Jewish -  
that was obvious. Since I do not  
know what all Arabs generally look  
like, it would be difficult for  
me to say flatly that this  
individual was an Arab although  
I am inclined to think  
that such is the case.

Generally speaking, the young  
woman's face was not (pretty) or

beautiful and her figure was trim. The face did not seem to be balanced and the nose other than its distortion, seemed on the small side. She probably was in her early twenties, and I doubt that she weighed one hundred pounds; it would be more like a weight somewhere in the nineties. In some ways she tends to remind one of a little girl, an undisciplined, rude little girl at that.

The young woman was wearing a light colored dress and at least part of her arms were exposed. It is difficult to say whether or not the dress had the polka dots on it because I observed the young woman in the covered

and would not have recalled her  
at all if she had not been  
very unladylike and rude. And

And then the "ambling-jaited" man  
didn't mean anything in this until I

California [redacted] and he seemed to think  
there is a possibility that the man I saw  
is the same individual he noted in a




In order to expedite matters and eliminate some duplication here in so far as my letter writing is concerned, I have reproduced a copy of the letter I wrote to [REDACTED] of the Los Angeles Police Department on August 18, 1968, including copies of the letter's enclosures which you do not have, and am sending the material to you for your files under cover of this letter.

The enclosed copy of the article appearing in the July 1, 1968 issue of the Los Angeles Herald-Examiner, "A Question Of Cash", about the Southern California Evangelist (Minister), the suspect in the Senator Robert F. Kennedy assassination case and another young man raised some questions in my mind in regard to the old automobile, and its occupants, I had seen coasting down Kenmore Avenue last June fourth; and I stated them in the letter to [REDACTED]. It also would be interesting to find out if the man, described by the Minister as "an older man who looked like the same nationality", walked with an "ambling gait" or "waddled" when he walked.

When I spoke to [REDACTED] three weeks ago, I told him about an odd letter (message) that came in the mail recently. I had wanted to read it to him over the telephone and get his opinion then, but he was busy at the time and he asked me to send a copy to him along with the other material. I got involved in a lengthy description of the puzzling item in my letter to [REDACTED] and would be repetitious to go through that part of the description again here, so please refer to the letter for this information too. I read the message to [REDACTED] he thought you might be interested in its contents. I also asked [REDACTED] his opinion about the message, and he seemed to think I had gotten on some screwball mailing list. Knowing that I had belonged to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], he made the suggestion that perhaps some over-zealous "philosophers", who have been attracted to its ranks, might have secured some mailing lists for their own use.. Whatever the case though, I certainly do not blame [REDACTED] in this instance, for it is a reputable organization. [REDACTED] seemed to think that a follow-up letter, telling how avoid "DOCK!" along with a pitch for money, might arrive in the mail before too long. To date this has not happened. However he did not rule out the possibility that it could have come from a Red source, and considering the general tone of the message, I would not overlook that possibility either. And finally, when I saw that 1963 date on the fifth and sixth lines from the top of the page, I thought "shades of George Orwell" because it reminded me of his novel "Nineteen Eighty Four". Perhaps there is an implication here somewhere. Upon

glancing through the book at the Santa Monica Public Library yesterday, it appears to me that whatever the author of the message wished to convey it could well be keyed to the Novel in some way; for I noted some similarities between the message and certain passages in the book. The thought has also entered my mind in all this that maybe this is somebody's idea of a joke, perhaps someone is having some fun. But whatever the reason, I don't like messages of this sort, signed or unsigned.

I did not send [REDACTED] the Peace Action Council flyer because there was no reason to do so but have included a copy in this letter for whatever it might be worth to you. Someone (a neighbor?) attached the original of the enclosed copy to the outside of the mailbox at [REDACTED] probably during the evening of July 9, 1968. I got home at about 11:00 P.M. on the ninth and saw something on the mailbox then but didn't bother to investigate to find out what it was at the time. It was discovered to be the P.A.C. trash when we got the mail the next day.

Here is the information I spoke about in our telephone conversation last Wednesday afternoon. You may keep all of the enclosures.

I corrected some of the sentences on pages 20, 27 and 28 of the July 2, 1968 Report I gave to you on July 3rd.; now these pages are easier to understand. I would appreciate it if you would incorporate the corrections into the Report. I wanted to get the information to you as quickly as possible last July and therefore just didn't bother to rewrite some of the awkward sentences at the time. The grammatical corrections did not change the facts; they are the same. And I have been able to get a reasonably good copy of the June 12, 1968 [REDACTED] which also is enclosed with the other material.

The enclosed article about the Southern California Evangelist that appeared in the Los Angeles Herald Examiner on July 1, 1968 raised my curiosity in regard to the incident concerning the automobile I observed being pushed North down Kennmore Avenue during the afternoon of June 4, 1968 ( See pages numbered 680702002 through 680702009 and 6806041500-1515 of the Report ). Although the description of the particular two young men in the article is very general, I have wondered if perhaps they were hitchhiking on June 3rd. due to a disabled automobile and also if the two young men picked up by the Minister were the same two I had seen with the old apparently disabled car the next day. I have underlined in red the information which might be pertinent here. The young man I saw seated in the pushed and coasting vehicle, although not in the best of light, looked very much like the newspaper photographs taken of the suspect shortly after the fatal shooting at the Ambassador Hotel on June 5th. And the impression I got of the young man I saw pushing the automobile tends to coincide with the Minister's observations.

I have tried to think of the make of the automobile I saw being pushed down Kennmore Avenue but can't pinpoint any particular name. Due to the poor condition of the car, probably because of age and use, I could only guess at its name. One characteristic I noted though was that it had that "boxy" (boxlike) look and seemed to be a standard size vehicle. I would venture to say that out of several possibilities it probably was a Chrysler Corporation automobile, an American Motors Corporation car ( an Ambassador model? ) or a Checker Motor Company vehicle ( such cars as used by the Checker Cab Company ) but the later would probably be too large an automobile in comparison to the one I saw on June 4th. I have a rather vague question in all this too; and that is, if the passengers of the automobile I

now coasting down Kenmore Avenue were in fact involved in the crime at the Hotel, would it be possible that the license plates, assigned to the apparently disabled vehicle, might have some association with or relationship to those license plates assigned to the suspect's car? It is somewhat of a far-out question but at least there are some known quantities here which might help zero in on the target and determine whether or not the automobile and the young man I had seen belong in the case.

And finally you will find a copy of the little bit of nonsense I mentioned that I had received in the mail on the 25th. or 27th. of July, probably on Saturday, July 27, 1968 along with the other enclosures. It is interesting and just seems to be some odd-ball mailing typical of these times. I am curious what you might think of the message ( esoteric? ) which was not signed and was mailed in an envelope without a return address. I don't associate this message with the subject-matter of my July 2, 1968 Report to your Office but do question its source and purpose anyway.

It appears as though the sender used an 8 1/2 x 11 inch sheet of writing paper in this little endeavor and apparently ripped it into thirds, for the message I received fits onto such a sheet of paper exactly three times. And the paper is rough along its length as though it was ripped along a straightedge. So perhaps the unsigned message printed in red was reproduced more than once and mailed to others. It appears to have been printed with a hand stamp and some of the letters seemed to have been used on a black ink pad at one time because a darker color has tended to bleed through at parts of the message giving an uneven red coloration to the total printed matter.

A copy of the envelope in which I received the "letter" is at the side of the message. I have never seen an envelope made in this fashion before; it is folded so that there is an appendage about two inches long on the inside at either end, and the flap sealing the envelope drops down evenly to about 40% of the vertical distance from the top and runs parallel to the top completely across its back or reverse side. Judging by its construction, it could have been made by hand from a single sheet of paper.

You will note that the exclamation point after the word "DOOM!", concluding the sentence at the third line from the bottom, is printed upside down. As far as I know the inverted exclamation point is placed at the beginning of an exclamatory sentence in Spanish and then the usual exclamation point is placed at the end of the sentence as in English. The interesting thing about this point is that it suggests the printer of the message might well have some knowledge of Spanish. Other than this observation concerning the message itself and the possibility it could be a veiled threat or the work of a crackpot or crackpot organization, your ideas as to its source and purpose --- beyond some thoughts I would state here --- are as good as mine.

What I have in mind is that, to the best of my knowledge, those people who are deeply enmeshed in the Communist conspiracy and are the front runners --- the "avant - garde" as I understand they prefer to call themselves --- use language in a different way ( esoteric ) in many instances, such as in the enclosed message, in order to conceal what they mean from just about everyone except their comrades in crime(s), and I would not overlook the possibility that they might

use this kind of language in an attempt to intimidate their enemies too.

I still recall enough of the features, including the general appearance, of the young woman I saw in the covered walkway at the Ambassador Hotel and believe this knowledge could be of value in helping a Police Artist develop any composite drawings of the young woman that might be ordered by the Police Department.

# Minister Tells Sirhan Plan to Buy His Horse

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A Southern California evangelist says he almost sold a horse to the man accused of assassinating Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, and now is hiding out in fear of his life.

The Los Angeles police, who he says have his story, decline comment.

The Orange County Baptist minister, who does not want his name used and who will be called Jones, was interviewed at a hideout less than 100 miles from San Francisco.

Present were two of his long-time friends, Oakland private detective Ben Hardister and San Francisco criminal attorney George T. Davis. Both say they advised Jones to stay out of sight and are seeking protection for him and his family. He says he has had two threatening telephone calls.

Here is the gist of his long story:

He picked up two hitchhikers in Los Angeles on Monday, June 3, the day before the California Democratic primary which Kennedy won.

Jones says one of the youths

was Sirhan Beshara Sirhan, the Jordanian accused of killing Kennedy. The other was taller, but seemed to Jones to be the same nationality.

Since Jones is a horseman by avocation and buys and sells horses and Shetland ponies, they talked of horses.

Sirhan wanted to buy a pony to exercise race horses so he could get a job at a race track. Jones had one that suited, but Sirhan said he would not have the price, \$300, until late that night.

Sirhan asked to be let off near the Ambassador Hotel "to see a friend in the kitchen." That night, Sirhan produced a \$100 bill, but said he wouldn't have the rest until 8 a.m. Tuesday.

At that time, Sirhan did not show up. Instead there was an older man who looked like the same nationality and said, "Joe couldn't make it." He said Sirhan really wanted the horse and could pay for it Tuesday night at 11 p.m. if Jones would deliver it at the same spot near the Ambassador Hotel where Jones had let him out.

The Ambassador is where Kennedy was shot.

Jones said he was preaching out of town and couldn't make it. He gave the older man, whom he described as about 35 and expensively dressed, his business card with his unlisted telephone number.

On Wednesday, Jones did not hear that Kennedy had been shot until he was having lunch with friends. A picture of the still-undisputed suspect was flashed on a television show, and Jones said he recognized the youth who had wanted to buy the horse.

The next day, Thursday, he got the first threatening telephone call, he said. An unaccented voice he could not recall having heard before told him:

"Keep your mouth shut about this horse deal if you know what's good for you."


Three days later the voice in another call reminded him he had been warned once before and repeated the profane threat to keep his mouth shut. He told police about the calls, and picked Sirhan's picture out of 30 they showed him.







The pictures apparently were developed subsequent to the assassination and a person strongly resembling SIRHAN SIRHAN appears from behind and between Senator KENNEDY and the unidentified Indian who is posing with him.

Mr. LAMONT stated a woman identified as [REDACTED] (ph) is alleged to have seen the photograph and knew the identity of the Indian woman who took the picture and owns the photograph was believed to reside in the outlying Los Angeles area.

LAMONT stated he visited an unrecalled woman employed at Disneyland Studios and viewed copies of the picture which he described as a snapshot size photocolor picture. He stated the face appearing between the Indian and the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY does have a striking resemblance to SIRHAN SIRHAN; however, he believes possibly the chin appeared to be too round and "thrust out" compared to later photographs observed of SIRHAN SIRHAN. He said the face in the photos was partially obscured by shadows.

Mr. LAMONT stated he submitted the pertinent information pertaining to this possibly "new photo" to the Los Angeles Bureau Chief of Time, Mr. MARSHALL BERGESS.
