The enclosed items consisting of various notes, books, and writings found in the room of the subject were obtained by the Los Angeles Police Department as evidence. United States Attorney WILLIAM MATTHEW BYRNE, JR., Central District of California, has been in contact with the office of Los Angeles County District Attorney EVELLE YOUNGER. Mr. BYRNE states this material should be handled like all other evidence, that is, the contents should remain confidential and not be disclosed publically prior to trial or to unauthorized individuals. Mr. BYRNE added that should the contents be disclosed, it could have a serious adverse effect involving successful prosecution in either Federal or State court and could needlessly subject the Federal Government to adverse criticism.

Taking all factors into consideration and if feasible, the Bureau may desire to consider the processing of the enclosed material for fingerprints. In addition, the Bureau is requested to make appropriate handwriting comparisons to establish the identity of the author and/or owner. At 7:23 A.M., 6/6/68, SA [REDACTED] General Investigative Division, telephonically called concerning the package of evidence transmitted to the Bureau on 6/5/68.

[REDACTED] stated inquiries have been received from the Laboratory and they desire to know (1) Has the information submitted been xeroxed? (2) Has the material been reviewed for lead purposes? (3) Have any efforts been made to obtain the services of an Arabic translator to translate the Arabic writing included in the material?

[REDACTED] was advised that the material had, in fact, been duplicated and would certainly be reviewed for lead purposes. He was advised that inquiry would be made concerning what arrangements, if any, are necessary to translate the Arabic material. [REDACTED] stated the Laboratory had indicated they may be able to obtain an Arabic translator if requested.

Inquiry at Los Angeles has determined that no arrangements have been made to obtain the services of an Arabic translator and that while xerox copies have been made of the material submitted, some of the material by its very nature could not be readily duplicated. In view of the necessity to transmit this material to the Bureau expeditiously, it was not possible to obtain legible copies of all the material transmitted to the Bureau.

It is also requested that upon completion of any other examination deemed advisable by the Laboratory, the above piece of paper be examined for any possible latent fingerprints and compared with the fingerprints of the subject in this case.

Los Angeles immediately review all of enclosed material for lead information. This review must be exhaustive, most thorough and probative. No suggested avenue of investigation is to be left unresolved.

The Bureau notes that the enclosed material mentions Gwendolyn Gun or Gum, Arcadia, California; address is listed as 91101 North 9th Street, (Q1-2); 1009 9th Avenue, (Q1-70). Numerous references to telephone 447-4974, evidently above individual's telephone number.

Numerous references located indicating possible romantic connection between writer and Miss Peggy (ie) Osterkamp, 13290 Archibald Avenue, Corona, California, (Q1-30, 31).

Q1-6 mentions Mario Valenzuela and Braulio Baeza.

Q1-8 shows number may be for telephone 8-2136, possible prefix "SY."

Q1-11 shows "Rathke, Tom Walter, Tom W. Rathke."

Q1-45 indicates writer recently employed by one John Weidner.

Specifically set out any names or other information which has not been resolved and set forth efforts being made in this regard.

Page Q1 - 43 which was translated from Arabic contains numerous Arabian names, including that of President Nassar, United Arab Republic. Investigation should be conducted concerning other Arabian names to determine if any of these may be local associates of Sirhan Sirhan.



Result of examination:

The signature on the available photocopy of the fingerprint card of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN (obtained by St. Horse Racing Bd., Los Angeles, California) is too limited and not sufficiently comparable with the questioned writing on the specimens described above for the purpose of determining whether SIRHAN wrote any of the questioned writing.

The submitted material is being returned separately to FBI, Los Angeles. This material has been photographed.

A translation of the foreign language material contained in the submitted specimens is attached.

Note for Los Angeles:

This supplements Bureau teletype dated 6/6/68 to Los Angeles in this case.

A separate report is being submitted concerning the fingerprint examination, at which time you will be advised with respect to the return of the submitted evidence.

Nothing significant was noted in the cryptanalytic examination of specimens Q1 through Q14.

Certain indented writings were found on pages of the notebook, Q3. It was found that these indented writings correspond to writings on other pages in the submitted material.

Various ink and pencil writings appear on the questioned documents. Faint writings consisting of ink transfers were noted on pages 63 and 122 of notebook, Q3. Ink transfers of this nature sometimes occur when documents are pressed closely together for some period of time. The faint writing on page 122 of Q3 is a transference of a portion of page 123 of Q3. The original document from which the ink transference on page 65 of Q3 originated does not appear to be contained in any of the submitted material.

The seven sheets of spiral notebook paper listed as Q5 correspond in physical features to the pages in the notebook, Q3. The sheets in Q5 were probably torn from Q3.

Stains appear on certain of the questioned documents. Since exhaustive Laboratory examination of the stains would entail destruction of portions of the documents, chemical examinations of the stains were not made.

Two copies of the translation of the foreign language material contained in the submitted specimens are forwarded to Los Angeles.

He was present, with members of his staff, when the autopsy was performed and is assisting Dr. THOMAS T. NOGUCHI of the Los Angeles County Coroner's Office. He does not desire that any information be given out concerning his presence in Los Angeles.

Commander STAHL desired to know on whose authority SA [REDACTED] had ordered a complete set of the photographs taken at the KENNEDY autopsy. Commander STAHL was advised that this was done specifically on the orders of the Special Agent in Charge, WESLEY G. GRAPP.

Commander STAHL stated that due to his staff being present at the autopsy, a number of extra photographs were made for medical reasons alone and desire to know whether such photographs would be necessary in the six sets ordered by the FBI. Commander STAHL advised that not all the photographs taken would be referred to in the autopsy report. He desired to furnish only those photographs that would be referred to in the autopsy report.

In view of the fact SA [REDACTED] was not available for contact at this time, SA [REDACTED] advised he felt sure that SAC GRAPP would want copies of all photographs taken at the autopsy so there would be no future slip-ups in this matter.

Commander STAHL was re-contacted on the personal, unlisted telephone number of Dr. NOGUCHI, [REDACTED] and informed that the order still stood as originally given, that the FBI desired six copies of all photographs taken at the time of the autopsy.

[REDACTED] drove the man to the vicinity of the University of San Francisco looking for a couple of girls and found none. [REDACTED] suggested they might find someone in the Haight-Ashbury District of San Francisco. [REDACTED] said the man seemed to be a complete stranger to San Francisco. He drove the fare to Stanyan and Haight Streets and picked up a white female juvenile, about 17 to 20 years old, medium build, long dark hair, wearing casual sports clothes. The girl agreed to present the flowers to Kennedy. They drove about a block more and located a white male juvenile, about the same age, with a large German Shepherd dog. The male is described as 5 feet 8 inches tall, 125 to 130 pounds, wearing dark brown clothes. The male agreed to accompany them in presentation of the flowers. Both the girl and male were complete strangers to his fare.

After picking up the two individuals at his fare's request, they drove back to the Hilton Hotel to pick up the flowers. The man went into the hotel and after waiting some time returned to the cab with two green boxes of long stem yellow roses. He sat in the front seat with the driver while the other two were in the back with the dog. The man instructed that they drive to KGO television station where Senators Kennedy and McCarthy were to appear.

[REDACTED] observed the man remove the flowers from the boxes and from a brown leather attache case he removed several of the same type of bronze-colored discs, possibly 10 or 12 all wired together with what appeared to be florist wire and wired this group of discs to the yellow roses. He repeated this with the other roses and another group of the discs. The metal discs had apparently been prepared ahead of time and each was wired with wire wrapped around the center of each disc, this being separate from the fine wire soldered to each disc. The man stated that these devices were "bugging devices" and indicated he was not sure but believed the fine wire was going to a telephone some way and the disc fit into the telephone.

The man gave each bunch of the roses to the girl and boy and instructed them to go to each entrance and give them to Kennedy. This was done so that if Kennedy missed one the other would be able to give him the flowers.

[REDACTED] said he drove to the television station, parked his cab on Polk Street and all three individuals left the cab and disappeared into the crowd about the time Senators Kennedy and McCarthy arrived. They were gone about 10 to 15 minutes. All three returned to the cab and the girl said she had personally given Kennedy her bunch of the roses. Disposition of the other bunch of the roses is unknown to [REDACTED]. The girl said to the man that the discs were apparent to persons in the crowd and several of the people in the crowd seeing the bouquet said "Hey, it's bugged".

[REDACTED] said the man seemed pleased that Kennedy had gotten the roses and he observed him pay each of the other two passengers five dollars plus some one dollar bills.

Some time during the cab ride the man had mentioned that McCarthy had gotten a similar bouquet in Los Angeles and he had come up here especially to present the flowers to Kennedy in San Francisco.

After the flowers had been given, the man asked [REDACTED] to take him to the San Francisco International Airport after he dropped off the other two. They drove back to the Haight-Ashbury District and the male with his dog got out. The female asked if he could drop her off at home in San Bruno inasmuch as they were going to the airport.

[REDACTED] said he took her home and believed he might possibly be able to locate the house again saying that it was in a group of tract homes. He is not sure and he did not record the address any place. He then drove the man to the San Francisco International Airport and believes he delivered him to the United Air Lines area. Cab fare was about \$18, and the man gave him \$35 and told him to keep the change. He described the unknown male fare as a white male American, about 50 years old, 5 feet 8 inches to 5 feet 9 inches tall, weighing 200 pounds, athletic build,

He wore a full mustache, gray-white in color and gave the impression of being Irish-Danish in descent. He had a fair complexion and a roundish face and wore a watch but no rings. He had on a brown coffee-colored type suit and stated sometime during the ride that he was a salesman for Encyclopedia Britannica. There was no noticeable accent in his speech.

The attache case he carried was of cowhide color and was a square-cornered case with a handle at the top and dividers and carried various papers as well as the metal discs.

bk On June 10, 1968, [REDACTED] Sixth Army Headquarters, Ordnance Section, Explosive Disposal Program, Presidio of San Francisco, examined the metal disc and could not identify it as an explosive device or component of any explosive device. 



It is nonsectarian in every respect and is not a religion, although the ethics of the Order adhere to the principles of Christianity. The teachings of this organization do not interfere with the religious freedom of its members.

Any law-abiding citizen of either sex and over twenty-one years of age, of good repute and having a firm conviction in a supreme being, is eligible for membership in the Grand Lodge of the Rosicrucian Order. The organization includes in its membership a cross-section of all classes of people. The membership includes manual laborers, prominent businessmen, directors of industries, physicians, attorneys, scientists, artists, editors, educators, and authors, who find the teachings stimulating and liveable. The Rosicrucian Order is nonpolitical and not aligned or associated with any movement, system, or group having political activities. The Rosicrucian oath of membership has for many years exacted the promise "that I will honor and respect the flag of my country and the country in which I live; that I will never be guilty of treason; that I will be a good and useful citizen contributing to the advancement and welfare of the country in which I enjoy the privilege of being a resident."

Mr. POOLE stated that the Order traces its origin to the mystery schools or secret schools of learning established in Egypt about 1500 B.C. 



**Results of examination:**

Specimen Q21, as received in the Laboratory, consists of a metal container, a piece of insulated wire and numerous black particles. Specimen Q21 is contained in a plastic envelope and the wire is not attached to the metal container.

The blast drum-shaped metal container in specimen Q21 is approximately 13/16" in diameter and approximately 5/16" thick. A 1/4" diameter brass rod extends from one side of the container and a mica diaphragm and brass plate are mounted on the other side. Black granules or particles are present in the container. The container appears to have been damaged before receipt in the Laboratory.


The metal container appears to be a microphone button of the type used in telephones manufactured twenty to thirty years ago. Microphone buttons of this type were manufactured in great quantities. These microphone buttons contain carbon granules which form a variable resistance under the influence of voice vibrations. Without additional components and circuitry, Q21 could not transmit special speech signals or otherwise act as a monitoring "bug."

The black particles present in Q21 are essentially carbon.

There are impressions on the metal container which appear to have been made by a tool employing a gripping action such as a pair of pliers. There are also scratch type marks on the container which are not sufficiently characteristic to determine the type object causing these marks. The marks and impressions on the metal container are suitable for comparison purposes.

The available writing of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN is too limited and not sufficiently comparable with the remaining questioned handwriting on the specimens previously submitted in this matter for the purpose of determining whether SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN wrote any of the remaining questioned handwriting. Similarities in handwriting characteristics were found in the writings of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and a number of the remaining questioned writings, including certain questioned writings on pages 20, 33, 39, 47, 51, and 53 of specimen Q1; pages 123 and 124 of specimen Q3, and the writing on Q4.

The signatures appearing on K15 are too limited to permit adequate comparison of these signatures with the questioned writings.

Specimen K14 is being returned to FBI, San Francisco. Specimens K15 and K18 are being returned to FBI, Los Angeles. These specimens have been photographed. The pamphlet described as "ALSO SUBMITTED" is being retained.

TRANSLATION FROM LATIN

The airmail envelope is addressed to Senator R. Kennedy and Senator Eugene McCarthy, Democratic National Headquarters, Eugene, Oregon.

It bears the postmark of West Palm Beach, Florida, dated May 29, 1968.

A line of French prose or poetry is pasted to the envelope in lieu of a return address. It reads:

A blase bird, if such a bird exists.

The printed message contained in the envelope is a portion of a page taken from a textbook version of Julius Caesar's "Commentarii de Bello Gallico." The portion marked "K" describes a battle in which the Gauls discarded their shields and fought "with their naked bodies."

The portion marked "M" contains descriptions of war actions against the Helvetii.

TRANSLATION FROM LATIN

Post card with airmail postage and an airmail notation addressed to Senator R. Kennedy, Democratic Headquarters, Eugene, Oregon.

The post card bears the postmark of West Palm Beach, Florida, dated May 21, 1968, A.M.

The message on the reverse side of the post card consists of two verses in Latin. They read:

I sing (celebrate) because of the compromise to be made on the swift vessel.

I was only reading the remaining part little by little.

The notation:

"(imperio) by command"

appears at the bottom of the post card.

**TRANSLATOR'S NOTE:**

The communication is anonymous. The verses appear to be taken from a Latin writing of the classical period, possibly Ovid. It is recalled that correspondence of a similar nature, consisting of verses taken from the classics was handled in the past. This correspondence, consisted for the most part of two or three Latin verses without any explanation.

The writing on the photocopy, Qc24, is too indistinct for adequate comparison of the Sirhan Sirhan signature and address thereon with the available writings of SIRHAN SIRHAN. If the original document for Qc24 or a clearer photograph is submitted, a more suitable examination can be made.

The additional purported handwriting of SIRHAN SIRHAN, designated as specimen K19 is too limited to permit a definite conclusion to be reached whether SIRHAN wrote any of the unidentified questioned writing on the specimens submitted in this matter. It was found that the writing on specimen K19 is of value as an additional handwriting standard of SIRHAN.

Re: Autopsy Report - Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

Dr. THOMAS T. NAGUCHI, M.D., Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner, Los Angeles County, advised that the photographs and report concerning the autopsy conducted by he and his staff on the body of the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY is still not complete. He said the delay is primarily due to one segment of the report which concerns the various organs of the body not directly related to the penetration of the bullets. He said, however, this report will probably be complete within the next week or so and he will probably advise the Los Angeles Office when it is ready. *PCompt*

In connection with the photographs taken during the post mortem examination, he pointed out that there may be between 200 and 300 photographs taken during the autopsy. The Los Angeles Office has requested six sets of photographs at a cost of 27 cents per photograph, therefore, the total approximate cost could be \$486.00.

It is recommended that Bureau authority be obtained to expend money in excess of \$400 to obtain these photographs in the event it is necessary.

Although there is no proven scientific basis for accurately determining qualities such as age, education, occupation, regional accent, etc., on the basis of a limited voice sample, the following subjective aural impressions based on the voice quality and language usage of the unidentified caller, are set forth:

The voice of the anonymous caller is that of a mature male, possibly between the ages of 35 to 45. Although the thoughts which he expressed are somewhat disorganized and vaguely stated, it is believed that the caller is intelligent and well read but probably has little if any formal education.

The accent of his initial comment seems to be somewhat affected "hillbilly;" but, thereafter, his accent can be broadly characterized as Southwestern United States. His speech patterns are idiomatic and do not appear to be contaminated by foreign influence.

It is noted that the anonymous caller, with the exception of his initial comment, pronounces his words fully without swallowing syllables or clipping word endings, particularly final (r).





12. Let them get me to America in some way. Your sister can do it. I was sick and because of my illness, I was turned down in 1966. My health has now improved, so let them call me for another physical. Your sister can do this for me.

13. To be frank, I am totally impoverished and without money. Now I clean streets. I should like to ask you, therefore, dear brother Ted, for \$1,000 help.
14. I will get in touch by mail with your sister, the wife of the Ambassador in Paris - I'll use the same green pen and tell her who I am.

The youth of the entire world is grateful to John and Bob Kennedy. May they live in eternal glory, and may the black soil in which they rest forever be light to them.

Long live Ted Kennedy, the avenger of his brothers.

Result of examination:

Specimen Q33 is the original letter for the photocopy Qc33. Q33 and the envelope in which it was mailed, designated Q.32, are described in FBI Laboratory report dated 8/23/68, a copy of which was furnished to the Director, U.S. Secret Service, Washington, D.C. Photocopies of Q32 and Q33 were furnished with FBI Laboratory report of 8/23/68.

Due to the indistinctness of the writing on Kc23 and Kc24, a definite conclusion was not reached whether [REDACTED] wrote the questioned writing on Q32 and Q33. Certain handwriting characteristics were noted in the purported known writing of [REDACTED] on Kc23 and Kc24 which are consistent with handwriting characteristics in the letter designated as Q33. These consistencies in handwriting characteristics indicate that Q33 may have been written by [REDACTED]

The submitted material is being retained in the FBI files.




Inasmuch as the communication may constitute a possible violation of the Extortion Statute Los Angeles should initiate immediate investigation in order to determine whether it was in fact prepared by Sharif Sirhan. Consideration should be given to conducting an immediate interview of the suspect.

Sirhan was advised by the FBI Agents that the inquiry related to the authorship of a two-page written document addressed to President Elect Richard Nixon and Vice President Hubert Humphrey, bearing the signature Sharif B. Sirhan. Mr. Sirhan was then orally advised by the FBI Agents of his rights. He was then asked to read an Advice of Rights Form. Mr. Sirhan interrupted this to say, "Before I say anything, I want to see the letter." A copy of the above-mentioned letter was given to him to read. He read it slowly, line by line, his hands visibly shaking, although he showed no other signs of emotion.

Mr. Sirhan then said, "I did not write this. It is not mine." He then indicated he was certainly in agreement with some of the political statements contained in the letter and had himself expressed some of these ideas, but he would not

specify which of these points he was referring to. He stated he also disagreed with some of the points in the letter.

Qc35 is described in FBI Laboratory report dated 11/12/68, addressed to Los Angeles.

No particular similarities were noted in the writings of SAIDALLAH SIRHAN and SHARIEF B. SIRHAN with respect to the questioned writing on Qc35.

Unless the original document for Qc35, or a clearer copy thereof, is submitted to the FBI Laboratory, it is doubtful whether future comparisons with known handwriting samples, will result in any definite conclusion. Therefore, at the present time there is no immediate need for Los Angeles to submit the original documents for Kc25 and Kc26 to the FBI Laboratory.

**Results of Examination:**

Qc36 was found to have been recorded at a non-standard speed on  $\frac{3}{4}$ -track recorder and contained an interfering hum. A copy of Qc36 was made by playing back Qc36 on a variable speed recorder adjusting the speed for a natural sound and equalizing the frequency response to enhance intelligibility.

The submitted Qc36 and two copies made as described above are being sent to Los Angeles under separate cover via registered mail.

It is noted that one portion of Qc36 near the middle of the recording appears to be either part of some prior recording that was not recorded over or part of a recording made over the original recording. The material during this section of the tape appears unrelated to other parts of the tape.

A determination as to whether any of the recorded material on Qc36 relates to the assassination of Kennedy was not attempted by the Laboratory since it is felt personnel in the Los Angeles Office familiar with the case would be in a better position to make such determination.

Re Los Angeles airtel to Director dated 12/19/69, Bureau letter to Legat, Ottawa, dated 2/26/69, and Bureau letters to Los Angeles dated 5/6/69 and 6/30/69.

Investigation developed information that PRUSZYNSKI was at the Ambassador Hotel when Senator KENNEDY was assaulted. He was assigned to the Kennedy Campaign as a reporter for Harper and Row Limited, Publishers, London. He made a tape recording of the events immediately subsequent to the assault which was made available and forwarded to the FBI, Laboratory for examination. Due to the poor quality of the original recording, the Laboratory reviewed the tape and made a dubbing from the original recording in an effort to enhance the intelligibility and reduce an interfering hum. The Laboratory suggested that the Los Angeles Office review the tape for any possible leads.

The Laboratory also provided an extra copy of the tape for dissemination to the Los Angeles Police Department.

A review of the recording was made at Los Angeles, however, it does not appear that anything pertinent to this investigation is contained on the recording.
